## CAMPUS SAFETY AT FULLERTON COLLEGE

The mission of the Fullerton College Campus Safety Department is to ensure the safety of students, faculty, staff, and visitors while on property owned or operated by the college or involved in college-sponsored programs and activities, and to protect the property and facilities of the district and its students, employees, and visitors. The Campus Safety Department is committed to providing the highest standard of professionalism and service.

## AVAILABILITY, LOCATION AND METHODS TO SUMMON LAW ENFORCEMENT ASSISTANCE

The Fullerton College Campus Safety Department provides 24-hour service to protect and render aid to the campus community. The department can be reached 24-hours a day by phone at 714-992-7080, ext. 0.

The Campus Safety Department Office is located at 321 East Chapman Avenue, Fullerton, CA 92832 in Building 1500, Staff Parking Lot C West (Off N. Lemon Street).

Campus Safety Officers are not peace officers; however, North Orange County Community College District Board Policy grants Campus Safety Officers authority to make arrests under California Penal Code 837. Fullerton College has a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Fullerton Police Department to handle crime-related reporting and investigations on the Fullerton College campus. Fullerton Police Department has jurisdictional authority over all crimes on campus.

### Crime Reporting

The campus community is strongly encouraged to report all known or suspected incidents of criminal activity on campus to the Campus Safety Department as soon as possible.

When calling the Campus Safety Department, always:

- Provide your name, telephone number and location
- Give clear and accurate information
- Be prepared to supply suspect and vehicle description, and direction of travel
- **Do not hang up** until you are instructed to do so by the Campus Safety Dispatcher

## **Emergency Phone Call Stations**

The button is pushed, the blue strobe light flashes from the top of the phone tower, the Campus Safety dispatcher is notified immediately, and the caller is able to talk directly to the dispatcher. There are also wall mounted phones throughout the campus as well as phones inside of elevators.

## **SPECIAL SAFEGUARDS FOR FACILITIES OR ACTIVITIES**

### **Security of and Access to Campus Facilities**

All campus facilities are key-accessed, and most are open daily for scheduled campus community use. Campus key control and distribution is a function of the Fullerton College Maintenance and Operations Division. The Campus Safety Department is responsible for locking all campus owned buildings.

### **Security Considerations Used in Maintenance of Campus Facilities**

Regular inspections and surveys of campus indoor and outdoor lighting, shrubbery and walkways are conducted. The Campus Safety Department works in conjunction with the Fullerton College Maintenance and Operations Division and participates in Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design concepts.

### **Special Event Safety Planning**

Preparation for large events on campus involves the creation of Incident Action Plans, according to the Standardized Emergency Management System and in collaboration with mutual aid agencies and contracted safety personnel as needed.

## **New Student Orientations**

Campus Safety Department personnel provide personal safety tips and emergency contact information to new students on a regular basis. Students are informed of policies, crime reporting procedures, and safety programs through regular outreach via email, social media, and tabling at events throughout the academic year.

## **ACTIONS IN THE LAST 18 MONTHS TO INCREASE SAFETY**

1. Completed update to access control systems in the Student Support Center (SSC)
2. Completed upgraded to Fire Alarm system in the 300 building and Maintenance and Operations Building to new system that performs better and has ability for multiple types of situations.
3. Conducted shelter in place, evacuation, earthquake drills on campus to better prepare campus community.
4. The addition of several security cameras at the SSC, new Maintenance and Operations Building, and on the 300 building.
5. Addition of an iron gate in the 400 building for better access control during evening hours.

## **SAFETY ENHANCEMENTS PLANNED FOR THE NEXT 24 MONTHS**

1. Continue to provide Safety Escorts services to the students.
2. Increase the frequency of safety training classes including "Stop The Bleed" and Community Emergency Response Training (CERT).
3. Replace smoke detectors with heat detectors in gender-neutral restrooms to decrease false alarms.
4. Partner with the Health and Safety Committee on a number of emergency preparedness tasks such as adding first aid kits to multiple buildings across campus.

## **RECORDS OF ON-CAMPUS CRIME**

California Education Code 67380(a)(1)(A)

North Orange County Community College District campuses are required by California Education Code 67380(a)(1)(A) to compile records of all occurrences reported to campus police, campus security personnel, or campus safety authorities of, and arrests for, crimes that are committed on campus and that involve violence, hate violence, theft, destruction of property, illegal drugs, or alcohol intoxication, and to make this

information available within two business days if requested by students, prospective students, employees, or the media.
